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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF DUZI-UMNGENI CONSERVATION TRUST (ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED UNDER SECTION 21)

Report on the financial statements

We have audited the annual financial statements of Duzi-Umngeni Conservation Trust (Association Incorporated Under Section 21), which comprise the directors' report, the balance sheet as at 29 February 2008, the income statement and the statement of changes in equity for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes, as set out on pages 3 to 12.

Directors' responsibility for the financial statements

The directors are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with South African Statements of Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's responsibility

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Those Standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

As is common to non profit organisations who receive a significant amount of their income by way of donations, we are unable to satisfy ourselves as to the completeness of income disclosed in these financial statements.

Qualified audit opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects of the abovementioned qualification, the financial statements present fairly, in all material aspects, the financial position of the company at 29 February 2008, and the results of its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with South African Statements of Generally Accepted Accounting Practice, and in the manner required by the Companies Act of South Africa.

Emphasis of matter

Without qualifying our opinion we draw attention to Note 11 in the financial statements which indicates that the company incurred a net deficit of R15,625 during the year ended 29 February 2008 and, as of that date, the company's total liabilities exceed its total assets by R18,467. These conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the company's ability to continue as a going concern.

Supplementary information

Without qualifying our opinion, we draw attention to the fact that the supplementary schedule set out on page 12 does not form part of the annual financial statements and is presented as additional information. We have not awaited this schedule and accordingly do not express an opinion on it.

1. Accounting policies

The following are the principal accounting policies of the company, which are consistent in all material respects with those applied in the previous year, except as otherwise indicated.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except as modified by the revaluation of freehold land and buildings.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Other than freehold land and buildings on which depreciation is not provided, depreciation is recorded by a charge to income computed on the straight line basis so as to write off the cost of the assets over their expected useful lives. The expected useful lives are as follows:

Equipment Years 3 - 7

Contract work in progress

Contract work in progress is valued at the estimated recoverable value of work performed not invoiced.

Impairments

The carrying value of the assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date to assess whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated. Where the carrying value exceeds the estimated recoverable amount, such assets are written down to their estimated recoverable amount.

Revenue
